 - Thrivent risk assessment request will discuss with the Endowment Team
 - Request for \$5,000 for Building Fund
 - What is the restriction on the Parsonage fund?

 - Designated: Food Shelf \$218.90, Backpack \$212, World Relief & Hunger \$229.18, Missionary \$4.28
